






The Intercollegiate Studies Institute (ISI) says its purpose is “Educating for Liberty” by “Inspiring college students to discover, embrace, and advance the principles and virtues that make America free and prosperous.” On October 23, it honors Peter Thiel, describing him as a technology entrepreneur, investor, and philanthropist who co-founded PayPal, which he sold to eBay in 2002 for \$1.5 billion. He founded Clarium Capital Management, described as a global macro hedge fund. The San Francisco Chronicle described him as “a proud gay Christian who has supported a wide range of causes including gay rights, freedom of the press, antiaging research and artificial intelligence.” He has funded a “seasteading” foundation that “wants to create artificial, self-governing islands some 200 miles off the California coast to serve as experiments in innovative political, social and legal systems.” He is also co-founder and chairman of Palantir Technologies, Inc., a “data-mining” firm whose customers reportedly include the NSA, the FBI and the CIA. Thiel claims Palantir software was used to track down Osama bin Laden.

## Peter Thiel, Believe It Or Not, Is A Marxist

Peter Thiel contributed \$2.6 million to Endorse Liberty, a Super PAC backing Ron Paul in the 2012 presidential election. He told “60 Minutes” it was an “investment in the future.” He added, “I think the future of this country will be more libertarian. I think the future of the Republican Party will be more libertarian. It will be a party that will believe in less government and less regulation but also in less war and less intolerance.”

Writing in Forbes, under the headline, “Peter Thiel, Believe It Or Not, is a Marxist,” Greg Satell notes that Thiel “quotes directly from Marx throughout” his new book, *Zero to One: Notes on Startups, or How to Build the Future*. I checked and he’s right. There are six references to Marx. For example, Thiel says Marx “had a belief in progress,” and quotes him as referring to the technological achievements of capitalism. What Thiel apparently doesn’t understand is that Marx anticipates that such “progress” will be eclipsed by socialism and then communism, as part of the dialectical process.

In this context, as noted by Australian writer Peter Myers, “Karl Marx advocated Free Trade, i.e. Capitalism, because (a) whereas Protection builds up the nation-state, Free Trade breaks it down, as a prelude to the creation of a world-state by the Capitalists (b) Free Trade breaks down traditional culture, as a prelude to the creation of a world culture (c) Free Trade exacerbates class warfare, and through this the Capitalists will lose control of the world-state - they will be defeated by the impoverished classes, with the help of their backers in the higher classes.” Hence, free trade opens the way for world revolution.


In my view, Thiel sees himself as an innovator in this new stage of capitalism -- what Marx saw as the highest stage of capitalism. In other words, Thiel is a globalist, with a vision of power and influence that goes far beyond the boundaries of the U.S. Thiel is in fact listed as a member of the Steering Committee of the Bilderberg Group, an elite organization of influential citizens from various countries.

Thiel has created a great business, PayPal, and promotes capitalism. But I don’t think he understands the Marxist historical process of which he claims to be a part.

For example, his Thiel Foundation claims to support “anti-violence” organizations. It says, “Violence is the most basic threat to freedom, whether it is manifested through

war, torture, slavery, conscription, oppression, or persecution for religious, political, or social beliefs. We support models and heroes of non-violence, as well as organizations that work to understand the origins and enablers of violence and how violence can be reduced.” The Thiel Foundation supports the Oslo Freedom Forum, a group doing admirable work. Speakers at the Oslo Freedom Forum have included a Russian activist, a North Korean defector, and a survivor of the Cambodian genocide. The latter, Sophal Ear, became an assistant professor of national security affairs at the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California.

In October 1917 we parted with the old world, rejecting it once and for all. We are moving towards a new world, the world of communism. We shall never turn off that road!



A Fortune magazine profile of Thiel said, “In high school Thiel admired the optimism and anti-communism of President Ronald Reagan, who gave him a sense that “there were sort of like all these answers that had finally been figured out and that were right.”” But there is no evidence that Thiel personally understands the role of Marxism in violence and terrorism and how we are still on the road to world communism, as Marx envisioned it. Instead, he naively sees the future as one in which “libertarian” values will somehow come out on top.

Thiel told the BBC that “the fall of Eastern Europe and of communism” was because “basically things like...the spread of fax machines enabled people to find out what's happening and to circumvent the official truths that had [been] promulgated by institutions like...in the Soviet Union.” Of course, that’s not what happened at all. Gorbachev’s “perestroika,” defined by the West as “openness,” was a ruse, part of the Marxist dialectic. It constituted the restructuring of the Soviet system, with Gorbachev himself saying in his famous 1987 speech that, “We are moving toward a new world, a

world of Communism. We shall never turn off that road.” Thiel seems to be unfamiliar with the real facts behind the “collapse” of communism and the subsequent rise of Russia and the Russia-China Alliance. We explain them in our new book, *Back from the Dead: The Return of the Evil Empire*.

With more than \$2.2 billion under his belt, Thiel wields power in multiple arenas. Cofounding PayPal earned the young gay entrepreneur a sizable fortune, but being Facebook's first outside investor turned Thiel into a powerhouse. He's the only openly gay man at the upper echelons of the investment industry and continues to invest in eccentric areas, such as antiaging efforts, space travel, and encouraging students to drop out of college. His focus of late has been on Palantir, a CIA-backed data-mining software company he thinks could be bigger than Facebook. A conservative libertarian, Thiel believes gay rights are a nonpartisan issue and supports many Republican candidates and conservative super PACs.

The homosexual “Out” magazine lists Thiel as one of its “power” players.

Investigative reporter Michael P. Tremoglie lists Thiel as one of the big name CEOs and rich elites who are financing the marijuana movement. He donated \$70,000 to Proposition 19, a measure to legalize marijuana that was on the November 2, 2010, California statewide ballot. It was defeated. California did, however, legalize “medical marijuana.”
